Tommy Dupree called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. He asked each visitor to stand and state their name and affiliation.

Tommy introduced new commission member, Timothy Nutt, representing the Arkansas Historical Association.

Tommy then called for the approval of the minutes from the October 27, 2010, ACWSC meeting. Cathie Matthews stated that the minutes were excellent and she enjoyed reading them. Mark Christ announced that this would be Dawn Burton-Washington's last meeting as recording secretary and that Administrative Analyst Darcy Baskin would be taking over that duty in future meetings. Tommy stated that Dawn has done a very good job and he appreciates her efforts. Carolyn Ashcraft moved for acceptance of the minutes from the October 27, 2010, commission meeting and DeeLois Lawrence seconded the motion. The motion passed.

### ***Consideration of Logo Use Requests and Discussion of Process*** **Logo Use Committee, ACWSC**

#### Commemorative Postal Covers

Joe Bateman and B. L. Timmerman

Both gentlemen were in attendance and Mr. Bateman spoke briefly about the process for the creation of their collectable postal covers from each major Civil War event with historical Confederate cancellation and stamp. He stated that he and Mr. Timmerman have been doing this for several years and brought several examples of their work from past events here in Arkansas and in Texas.

The use period is for events that occur during the entire Arkansas Civil War Sesquicentennial commemoration.

After a brief summary of how he and Mr. Timmerman make their profit, Mr. Bateman answered a few questions from commission members.

Richard Davies asked how the two men started their business. Mr. Bateman replied that he started in the '50s as a Boy Scout and has a love of stamp collecting.

Mark Kalkbrenner stated that he owned one of the covers that he purchased at Prairie Grove. He stated that he already had the cancellation on it and he paid \$2 or \$3 for it.

George Lankford asked if the post office approved the postal covers. Mr. Bateman stated that the post office encourages the postal covers.

Carolyn Ashcraft asked if a person could purchase a postal cover if they are not able to attend the event. She stated that she would like to reserve one of each of the covers for the Arkansas State Library.

DeeLois Lawrence asked if Mr. Bateman and Mr. Timmerman took requests to do covers for certain events. Mr. Bateman stated that their plans are to do all of the events in Arkansas. He added that he and Mr. Timmerman already have events scheduled in Mississippi, Oklahoma, and Texas for which they will produce covers.

Richard Davies moved and Danny Honnoll seconded a motion to approve the use of the commission's logo for commemorative postal covers for Arkansas Civil War Sesquicentennial events. The motion passed.

Parrish-Raley Family Reunion

Darcy Baskin asked the commissioners to read the comments on the back of the logo use request form from Tricia Turner for the Parrish-Raley Family Reunion. The event will occur Saturday, July 2, 2011, at the Diamond City Community Center in Baxter County.

George Lankford asked if this event is for the family. Darcy replied that this is a public event. Jamie Brandon stated that he would be interested in knowing about the family.

Mark Christ stated that this is a local event. Danny Honnoll added that his family invites friends and family to their family reunions. He agrees that this is a local event like the commission is looking for.

Danny Honnoll moved and Richard Davies seconded a motion to approve the use of the commission's logo on the Parrish-Raley Family Reunion mail-out. The motion passed.

Revolution and Rebellion: Words, Wars & Figures – Temporary Exhibit

Clinton Presidential Center

The exhibit focuses partially on the Civil War by exploring the complex story of the United States. The exhibit is on display from December 11, 2010, through May 22, 2011.

Carolyn Ashcraft moved and Danny Honnoll seconded a motion to approve the use of the commission's logo on the press releases and onsite signage for the exhibit. The motion passed.

“To Prevent the Effusion of Blood – the Arsenal Crisis of 1861”

MacArthur Museum of Arkansas Military History

This will be a symposium and demonstrations on the impact of the Arsenal Crisis in commemoration of the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the crisis. The event will be held at the MacArthur Museum on Saturday, February 12, 2011.

Richard Davies moved and George Lankford seconded a motion to approve the use of the commission's logo on the flyers for the event. The motion passed

### Book Review, Sale & Signing

This will be a book review, sale, and signing of “Belle in the Slouch Hat” by Fayetteville, Arkansas, author Mimi Mathis.

George Lankford asked about the location of the Boone County Library. Several commission members stated that it is in Harrison.

DeeLois stated that she was impressed that this event will appeal to children.

Mark Christ asked Darcy how the committee members responded to this logo use request. She responded that were three and Carolyn Ashcraft was for allowing use.

Danny Honnoll moved and DeeLois Lawrence seconded a motion to approve the use of the commission’s logo on the event advertisement flyers and handouts during the event.

Cathie Matthews asked if the book can be purchased and Carolyn Ashcraft responded that it could. The book will be sold at the event.

### 70<sup>th</sup> Annual Conference of the Arkansas Historical Association

Arkansas Historical Association

The conference of the AHA will have themes that relate to the Civil War and will be April 14-16, 2011, at various sites in Little Rock.

Richard Davies moved and Jamie Brandon seconded a motion to approve the use of the commission’s logo on flyers, programs, and ads for the AHA conference. The motion passed.

### 148<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Battle of Chalk Bluff

Clay County

Sons of Confederate Veterans

NEACWHTC

The event will include relic and informational displays, speakers, re-enactments, and demonstrations. The event will be on April 30 – May 1, 2011 at Chalk Bluff Natural Area in Clay County.

Danny Honnoll added that there is usually a 300 to 500 visitor draw for this event.

Carolyn Ashcraft asked if the event will reoccur on the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary also. Danny and Mark Kalkbrenner explained that it would and that they alternate years with an event at Marks’ Mills.

Jamie Brandon had some concerns about relics being sold at this event. Danny assured him that relics are only for display.

Carolyn Ashcraft moved and Mark Kalkbrenner seconded a motion to approve the use of the commission's logo on handouts and newspaper and television advertisements. The motion passed.

"A Heritage Chautauqua: Civil War in the Ozarks Facts & Fascination"  
Eureka Springs Downtown Network, Inc.

This event involves lectures, panel discussions, and living history events. It will be Thursday, May 12, 2011, at the Basin Park Hotel at 12 Spring Street in Eureka Springs.

Richard Davies explained that a Chautauqua is when where people joined together to discuss important issues of the day and learn about new things. People would act out a particular historical event and answers questions as if they are the character that they are playing.

Richard Davies moved and Jamie Brandon seconded a motion to approve the use of the commission's logo for newspaper, radio, all promotional materials, and the event schedule for the May 12, 2011, event. The motion passed.

George Lankford asked about the Eureka Springs Downtown Network. Mark explained that is like a junior membership in the Main Street Arkansas program. They don't have full-fledged Main Street program, but they work with the Main Street staff to revitalize their downtown.

George asked if the Main Street program is doing anything to commemorate the Sesquicentennial. Mark stated that at the last quarterly meeting of the Main Street program he presented information regarding the Civil War Sesquicentennial Commission and the upcoming Sesquicentennial events.

Civil War 101 – Arkansas  
South Arkansas Historical Foundation

This event is a lecture given by Mark Christ on Arkansas and its place in Civil War history. It will be held Monday, May 23, 2011, at the Newton House Museum in El Dorado.

Jamie Brandon moved and Carolyn Ashcraft seconded a motion to approve the use of the commission's logo on flyers and promotional materials for the May 23, 2011, event. The motion passed.

North Arkansas Ancestor Fair  
Searcy County Historical Society

Russell Baker of the Arkansas History Commission will give talks on finding Union and Confederate ancestors. James Johnston will give talks on Searcy County and North Arkansas in the Civil War. There will also be a seminar in which descendants will share

their Civil War stories. The event will be on June 3-4, 2011, at the Marshall Civic Center on Zach Road.

George Lankford moved and Mark Kalkbrenner seconded a motion to approve the use of the commission's logo on posters, brochures, and advertising for the June 3-4, 2011, event. The motion passed.

"Why Commemorate the Civil War"

U of A Continuing Education Global Campus

U of A Road Scholar Program #1103

This event will include a lecture and living history format. The event will be Thursday, June 9, 2011, at the University of Arkansas Continuing Education Global Campus Small Auditorium in Room 107.

Carolyn Ashcraft asked what a Road Scholar is. Jamie Brandon explained that it is one of the Global Campus programs. Darcy Baskin added that it is educational travel and learning for adults.

Richard Davies moved and George Lankford seconded a motion to approve the use of the commission's logo on printed preparatory materials and printed program event schedules. The motion passed.

The Huntsville Massacre

Shiloh Museum of Ozark History

This event is a lecture focusing on the Huntsville Massacre of 1863. It will be held on Wednesday, September 21, 2011, at the Shiloh Museum.

Richard Davies asked Mark Christ if he knew about this battle. Mark stated that it involved Unionist Bushwhackers.

George Lankford moved and Jamie Brandon seconded a motion to approve the use of the commission's logo on printed flyers for the September event along with use of the logo on the museum's website. The motion passed.

General Patrick R. Cleburne Scholarship

Military Order of Stars and Bars (MOSB)

The MOSB is seeking use of the commission logo for an artwork print of General Patrick Cleburne that will be sold to provide funding for a college scholarship.

The scholarship will be awarded in November of 2014 at a ceremony in Fayetteville. This is a new scholarship.

DeeLois explained some of the details of the print. It will be an 11x14 drawing. It will be a black and white rendering.

George Lankford asked what MOSB stood for and DeeLois stated that it was the Military Order of Stars and Bars and then asked that Danny Honnoll to explain the organization to George since he is a member. Danny explained that the organizations members are descendants of Confederate officers. He also stated that there are about 4,000 to 5,000 members.

Richard Davies moved and Carolyn Ashcraft seconded a motion to approve use of the commission's logo on the artwork print. The motion passed.

Mark Christ stated that there would be increasing requests for logo use. He wants to expand the blanket approval to include other types of events that without question would be accepted such as request by people from the speakers bureau with a Civil War Arkansas topic, any ACWSC grant-funded activities, and places that will requesting the traveling exhibit.

Richard Davies suggested having Mark just approve logo use for events or materials that he feels are not questionable and then have the commission decide on the ones that Mark thinks may be questionable.

Mark suggested wording changes be made to the original wording of the logo use guidelines. The guidelines are currently worded; all requests for use of the commission logo will be reviewed by the commission's logo use committee, which will present its recommendations at the next meeting of the full commission. He suggests changing it to say all requests for use of the logo will be reviewed by the logo use committee, which will approve the request or forward it for consideration at the next meeting of the full commission.

Richard Davies moved and George Lankford seconded a motion to reword the guidelines of the blanket commission logo use request. The motion passed.

### ***Report on Grant Committee***

Darcy Baskin reported on round 1 grants.

- 1) **Title:** "War in the 60s" documentary  
**Applicant:** TeleVision for Arkansas, Jack E. Hill  
**Area Benefiting:** Arkansas, southern Missouri, Oklahoma, west Tennessee, Mississippi  
**Amount Requested:** \$2,000  
**Match:** Cash: \$30,500  
In-Kind: \$13,000

**Project Summary:** “The specific project to be funded by this grant is a trip to Franklin, Tennessee as part of a larger documentary concept to produce the primary video connected with Arkansas’s commemoration of the Sesquicentennial of the Civil War. A major battle involving Arkansas was in Franklin.”

“The full documentary will be an hour and will air on AETN, Ozarks Public Television, Oklahoma Educational Television, Mississippi Public TV, and on the PBS station in Memphis, WKNO.”

“War in the 60s is an evergreen piece that can air throughout the Sesquicentennial and thereafter. Additionally, we hope to place a copy in every Arkansas public library.”

- 2) **Title:** The Heritage Festival  
**Applicant:** Community Services Clearinghouse of Fort Smith, Richard S. Foti  
**Area Benefiting:** Fort Smith and Arkansas River Valley  
**Amount Requested:** \$2,000  
**Match:** Cash: \$2,000  
In-Kind: None listed

**Project Summary:** “The Heritage Festival is an annual event sponsored by the Community Services Clearinghouse of Fort Smith to raise funds for the Meal for Kids program as well as raising awareness of the unique heritage of our area. We include visits to the National Historic Site, Fort Smith Museum of History, National Cemetery, the historic Belle Grove residential area, the African American business and religious center, and Garrison Avenue Wild West re-enactors. There are performances by Latino, Asian, and Irish Dancers, an Indian Powwow and a gospel concert. This year, a commemoration of the Civil War is also being planned.”

- 3) **Title:** Encyclopedia of Arkansas History Civil War Articles  
**Applicant:** Encyclopedia of Arkansas History/Central Arkansas Library System, Nathania Sawyer

**Project Summary:** “During the four-year Civil War Sesquicentennial, the Encyclopedia of Arkansas History & Culture (EOA) aims to develop a possible 217 new entries on Civil War military events in Arkansas. These entries will be on some of the lesser-known skirmishes across the whole state, thus adding a new dimension to both local history and Civil War scholarship.”

“The EOS is the state’s premier historical resource, having received hits from 188 countries across the globe, as well as regularly cited by local, state, and national news sources.”

- 4) **Title:** Civil War Trails Motorcycle Brochure & Patch

**Project Summary:** “Civil War Trails Motorcycle Brochure – Two-color brochure, measuring 14 x 8.5 inches, flat, accordion fold to 8.5 x 3.5, graphic will utilize existing trails, with updates to present day roads and byways in which motorcyclists can follow the eight campaigns throughout Arkansas using the Arkansas Map of the Heritage Trail Brochure found on page 12 attached. Promotion will include designing an ‘I Road the Civil War Trail’ patch available to first 1,000 motorcyclists that complete all eight rides and send a photo to confirm their ride to the destinations to [grouptavel@arkansas.com](mailto:grouptavel@arkansas.com). Project would be launched in detail at March 6-8, 2011 Governor’s Conference on Tourism, Little Rock. Distribution of the brochures would be through fourteen Arkansas Welcome Centers, Group Travel tradeshows, state inquiry fulfillments and motorcycle dealerships and rallies throughout Arkansas.”

- 5) **Title:** DeValls Bluff Civil War Program  
**Applicant:** The Bill & Sharon Arnold Family Foundation/Curtis Arnold  
**Area Benefiting:** DeValls Bluff, Prairie County, AR  
**Amount Requested:** \$2,000  
**Match:** Cash: \$2,500  
In-kind: N/A

**Project Summary:** “The newly refurbished Prairie County Community Center in DeValls Bluff will be the scene of a series of program events on April 23, 2011 devoted to celebrating Civil War history. The events will range in nature from an exciting reenactment involving live cannon fire to a dedication of five new Civil War wayside markers (funded in part by the Arkansas Civil War Sesquicentennial Commission’s Grant Marker Program). The day promises to be the largest commemoration ever of the critical (but often neglected) role that DeValls Bluff played in the Civil War.”

One grant was not funded in the round 1 grant cycle.

- 1) **Title:** “Seasonal Civil War Articles”  
**Applicant:** Glen Schwarz  
**Area Benefiting:** Central Arkansas

**Amount Requested:** \$2,000

**Match:** Cash: \$2,000 from private donors/ad sponsors  
In-kind: \$2,000 from author's historical knowledge, research and writing ability. Graphics artist for illustrations, webmaster to put online.

**Project Summary:** "Quarterly articles on the most important Civil War events in Arkansas for the season. This series of 1,000 word articles will be published in popular periodicals in central Arkansas, or as a last resort, self-published in a tabloid format."

### *Update on Historical Marker Program*

Mark Christ stated that there are 13 markers currently in the ground. The most recent dedication is for the Battle of Arkansas Post. There are two being fabricated and they are expected to be delivered sometime in the next month. They are for the skirmish in Tomahawk in Searcy County and the other is for the Civil War in Batesville.

The commission still has \$25,000 from Preserve America and \$40,000 from the Natural and Cultural Resources Council.

Mark stated that an average marker costs \$2,030. The commission pays \$1,000 and the applicant pays a match of \$1,030. The Humanities Council has been helping some applicants with the matching funds.

### *Update on Heritage Trails Program and Highway Signage*

Richard Davies stated that the brochure is out and on the Arkansas.com website. Richard reported that he has spoken with Dan Flowers of the Arkansas Highway Department. Mr. Flowers stated that they have not forgotten about the project and they are seriously considering how to go about placing sign. Richard added that there are a number of routes.

Tommy Dupree asked who determines exactly what signs go on the highway. Richard responded that it would be the Highway Department.

Tommy explained about the Reed's Bridge sign placement. He is concerned about permission for placement of the Heritage Trails signs.

Richard explained sign coloring and who pays for particular types of signs.

A guest from the audience asked about the types of signs that the commission is talking about and if they would direct a visitor to a particular marker. Richard responded that the signs would just be for the trails. Mark Christ stated that contact can be made with the highway department. He believes that they will place signs for markers.

Tommy suggested inviting a representative from the highway department to the next commission meeting. Richard stated that he would give them a call and invite someone from the highway department.

### ***Discussion of Traveling Exhibit***

Mark Christ stated that the text and images are completed for the traveling exhibit. We will debut the exhibit on the second floor at the Cox Center in May 2011. After that, the exhibit will travel around the state and be distributed by the Arkansas Humanities Council.

Richard Davies asked how a request is made to use the exhibit and how long a requestor is allowed to keep it. Mark stated that he and the Arkansas Humanities Council are still working out those guidelines.

A guest asked if there was a Civil War display in the Big Mac Building. He was advised that the Arkansas History Commission has a display on the second floor.

### ***Update on Passport Program***

Mark Christ stated that Laura Miller is no longer with the commission and she has been replaced with Tim Nutt.

Mark stated that he plans on getting the passports and stamps distributed to the stamping location before the end of February so that they will be ready for the kick-off of the passport program in March. Carolyn Ashcraft asked about obtaining a passport and Mark stated that they would be available at Welcome Centers and stamping sites. George Lankford asked how to explain the program. Mark explained the process of how the program works and after receiving all 23 stamps a participant will be able to obtain a coin or patch.

Jack Hill asked if there were any other states doing a passport program, and Mark responded that was not aware of any.

Jamie Brandon expressed his thanks to Laura Miller for coming up with the passport idea.

### ***Update on DAH Cell Phone Tours***

Mark Christ stated that all of the recordings have been done for the cell phone tours. There were 9 for battlefields in Arkansas and the Historic Preservation Program has recorded several for individual buildings in the central Arkansas area. Signage will be done next. This will give tourists instruction on how to use their cell phones to access the recorded tours. The commission will have to get permission from the sites to place the signs.

Richard Davies asked about Prairie Grove. Mark stated that a tour recording could be done for Prairie Grove. He stated that the basic tour for the battlefield right now is 4 or 5 minutes about the battle that took place. There is also the option like the ones done by Rachel Silva that include expanded context. There are several push button options that would give additional information about the sites. Mark added that these cell phone tours would also be good for the unmanned sites.

### ***Discussion of 2011 General Assembly***

Richard Davies stated that budgets are not out yet.  
Mark Christ added that there has also been no word about the ACWSC budget.

### ***Discussion of 2012 ACWSC Event***

John Scott and Susan Young are working on this event and since neither is present at the meeting, the commission will have to wait on a report from John. The opening event will be on April 30, 2011, at the Old State House. There will be reenacting of the Secession Convention, there will be recruiting of various militias on the State House lawn, and the AETN documentary will be broadcast at some point during that day.

### ***Discussion of date(s) and location of next ACWSC meeting***

Mark Christ stated that the commission will meet April 27, 2011, unless the commissioners want to change the meeting day.

Mark Christ explained the events that will take place during the kick-off.  
Richard Davies suggested moving the meeting day to Friday, April 29, 2011. There was a brief discussion about the next meeting date.

Mark then asked about location of the next meeting. Richard thought meeting at MacArthur Museum of Arkansas Military History. Carolyn Ashcraft also suggested the State Library.

The meeting will be April 27, 2011, at the MacArthur Museum of Arkansas Military History.

### ***ACWSC Subcommittee Reports***

There were no official subcommittee reports, but Richard Davies announced that the new Arkansas History Commission web page is up.

Mark Kalkbrenner stated that the Sons of Confederate Veterans has been doing weekly articles in the Arkansas Toothpick and other publications.

Mark Christ urged committee members to respond to emails in a timely manner.

George asked if there was an update on the speaker's bureau and Mark Christ stated that it is on the ACWSC website and there are 14 people listed. No one has called him, but he thinks it will get busier as people want to do more events.

Carolyn Ashcraft stated she would love to have copies of newsletters in the State Library such as the Arkansas Toothpick and other newsletters and publications. She also stated that there will be future logo requests for book markers that the State Library will be developing for 3 age groups. They will be for children under 13 year old, teenagers, and adults. There will also be upcoming articles written in the Arkansas State Library Journal promoting the Civil War Sesquicentennial.

Tommy Dupree asked Jake Sandlin from the Arkansas Democrat Gazette about having a series of articles printed in the Arkansas Democrat Gazette with an Arkansas Civil War theme.

### ***New Business***

Mark Christ stated that KUAR will start recording Sesquicentennial Minutes, with the broadcasts beginning in February.

Mark also stated that AETN will film the documentary that the commission is sponsoring on the evening of March 2, 2011. It will be at the Old State House, starting at 7:00 p.m. He is going to ask directly some of the people that have not responded. There is limited audience space and will be broadcast in the old House chambers at the Old State House. Commission members will have first crack at participating. It would take 3 or 4 hours to get an hour of footage.

There is a limited amount of space for guests. Mark asked who all would be attending. Tim Nutt, DeeLois Lawrence, Wendy Richter, and Danny Honnoll stated that they would not be able to attend.

Mr. Bateman stated that the art work can be done by a local artist and suggestions are welcomed for their commemorative postal covers.

Richard Davies invited everyone to visit the exhibit on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor at the History Commission.

Guest Dewey Spencer spoke briefly about the Battle of Cotton Plant, July 7, 1862. He stated that he had found maps and he is thinking about placing a marker and asked for help from the commission.

Danny Honnoll stated that he has a brochure that he did on the battle. He stated that there is a marker at the Cotton Plant post office. He also said that he would support the gentleman. The guest also stated that he has made contact with the Woodruff County Historical Society and is a member of the White County Historical Society since that is where he lives.

George Lankford stated that one of the editors of the Batesville Guard asked him to tell the commission not to trust internet graphics. They had to redo the picture of a scroll and gun design for the paper that had the wrong period gun. It caused a delay for the paper.

DeeLois Lawrence stated that the Arkansas UDC is helping Virginia in one of their celebrations. There is a group of 3<sup>rd</sup> Arkansas buried in Winchester, Virginia. They have raised money to help Virginia purchase a marker for the 3<sup>rd</sup> Arkansas. The marker dedication will be June 6, 2011, in Winchester.
